## **School Facilities**

All classrooms are equipped with a smart TV. Other school facilities include a student activity centre, a multimedia computer learning centre, a library, a student activity centre, an English activity room, a gym room, a counselling yard, a mindfulness education room, multi-purpose rooms for student leaders, etc.

# (2) Achievements and Reflection on Major Concerns; Feedback and Follow-up

Major Concern 1: To elevate academic and non-academic achievements through enhancing learning and teaching effectiveness and widening students' exposure.

#### **Achievements**

This major concern was achieved through various policies and measures: Some salient examples include the following.

- (1) Measures Further Catering for Learner Diversity
- Although there was no streaming, the school had arranged split classes for F.1 F.3, F.6
   English Language, F.1 Chinese Language, and F.4 F.6 Mathematics to cater to
   different abilities. Specific groups for Chinese Language had also been arranged for
   Non-Chinese Speaking students in F.1 F.3, and F.5.
- We arranged various after-school and Saturday enrichment classes to cater for students of different abilities and backgrounds in order to help them enhance their academic performance. Examples include English and Math enhancement classes, English advanced writing and public speaking classes as well as Math Olympiad classes for junior and senior levels. Besides, we had English and Math enhancement classes for newly arrived students in particular to help them adapt. As for our non-Chinese speaking students, we had a year-round After-School Programme for them as additional support.
- With our Talent Pool composed of our top students in the subjects and selected ones from those nominated by teachers, different programs were arranged for them to join, like English debate, Forensic Science Enrichment Program, Mathematics Olympiad training, etc.
- Challenging questions with bonus marks were included in test and exam papers to stretch the potential of high achievers in junior levels.
- (2) Revision Week
- A week before the exam was reserved for revision with students with no new subject content taught.
- (3) Half-Day Lessons Before Final Exams
- Half-day lessons were implemented one cycle before the final exam to provide additional focused preparation time for students.
- Students utilized the conference room for self-study after school, which provided them with a conducive environment for focused study.

- (4) Differentiated Additional Lessons for F.6 Students
- Not all F.6 students had to attend additional lessons. The Chinese Language and English Language Departments selected only the weaker ones to give them extra help.
- Other subject departments selected different batches of students for additional lessons
  after the paper checking week of the First Mock Exam. Subject panels developed
  subject-based remedial and enhancement measures to cater to the diverse needs of these
  students.
- (5) Final-Effort Additional Lessons and Self-Study During Study Break for Form 6 Students
- Final-effort additional lessons were arranged for selected Form 6 students following the completion of the paper checking cycle of the second mock exam. The purpose of these additional lessons was to provide targeted support and practice to enhance these students' performance.
- In the morning, the focus was on English oral practice. To facilitate post-mock examination practices in the afternoon, a Special Timetable was devised.
- While the above-mentioned lessons were compulsory for the selected batch of students, other students could also opt to join. Alternatively, they could utilize the time for selfstudy either in school or at home.
- The conference room for self-study during the study break provided students with a conducive environment for focused study.

#### (6) Professional Development Initiatives

- Our Open Classroom Lesson Observation provided a valuable platform for teachers to collaborate, share their best practices, and foster a culture of professional development. The targets of the lessons include:
  - To implement BYOD strategies to engage students in learning
  - To naturally link the lesson with Values Education/ National Security Education
  - To set up clear and achievable learning and teaching objectives
  - The alignment of pre-lesson preparation tasks with classroom teaching to promote students' learning
  - > To cater for learner diversity
  - 11 teachers were invited to open their classrooms to colleagues. All teachers observed at least 1 lesson and post-lesson discussions promoted peer collaboration among teachers. They shared ideas, gave feedback, and developed new approaches to foster learning and teaching.
- Through peer assignment observation, teachers exchanged ideas, provided feedback, and developed innovative approaches to foster learning. For instance, language teachers shared effective note-taking and essay writing techniques that could be adapted across different subject areas.
- The 4th Staff Development Day (SDD) provided an excellent opportunity for teachers observing the open lessons and peer assignments to share their experiences and reflections with colleagues. The positive feedback, with over 90% of responding teachers agreeing that the sharing was beneficial for their professional development, underscored the value of this collaborative initiative.

#### (7) Science and STEAM efforts

- Talented and interested students were arranged to take part in various external Science, technology and STEAM competitions and programmes to broaden their horizons and showcase their abilities, with many of them winning awards. Some of the competitions and events we joined include:

- Notably, our STEAM Carnival, coordinated by our Science, Technology, Art and Mathematics KLA, was successfully carried out with over 200 participants from all levels. With 10 information and game zones related to the applications of science and technology, students were invited to explore and have fun.

- Notably, our students again actively participated in the 76th Hong Kong Schools Speech Festival. With more than 200 of them joining the competition, an impressive 82% earned Merit Certificates as a testament to their talent and hard work.
- Also, we did well with our original musical, *Curse of the Wand*, in the Hong Kong School Drama Festival. Apart from reaping the awards of Outstanding Stage Effects and

Outstanding Cooperation, we also had the stellar acting of Anna Liu (Brianna), Carson Hu (Liam), Harry Choi (Larry), and Hayden Kong (Basketball Player) well recognized with the Outstanding Performers Award. With our equally splendid performance at the EMI Drama Fest 2025, our team was honored to be invited to perform at the Fest's Prize Presentation Ceremony. The play earned us awards of Outstanding Performance, Outstanding Directing as well as Outstanding Performer Award for Anna portraying Brianna.

- To equip our students to become future leaders, we organized a variety of training programmes and camps like Trek and Grow 2-day-1-night Leadership Training Camp, prefect training camp, counselling prefect training camp, and more.
- Our Form 3 to Form 5 students were required to pay a visit to the Information Days of universities in order to be able to learn about their future study opportunities and career paths early.
- Workplace visits to Hotel Icon, Moorgen, Vessel Traffic Centre, Central Mail Centre, etc. were arranged to raise students' awareness of career planning and let them explore various authentic work contexts of an array of industries like hotel, service, innovation and technology, transportation, public service, and more.
- We launched a year-round Alumni Mentorship Scheme to help students explore different occupations, facilitate their career planning and provide opportunities for them to build connections and learn from our alumni from various fields, including medical, engineering, disciplined services, as well as banking and finance, through a series of meet-ups and workplace visits.

#### Reflection

- The promotion of BYOD may further strengthen the effectiveness of the lesson and students' self-learning ability.
- Teachers noted that discussing the open lesson could be challenging if not all members were present in the same lesson.

#### Feedback and Follow-up

- More work can be done to further promote BYOD in school step-by-step. Hardware inspection and the development of teaching strategies related to BYOD are in progress.
- It was suggested that KLA members could either attend the same lesson together or view a recording of the lesson prior to the discussion.

## Major Concern 2: To enhance students' well-being through cultivating positive values and appreciative ethos.

#### **Achievements**

This major concern was achieved through various initiatives and activities. Some salient examples include the following.

#### (1) Gratitude Day

Our Gratitude Day was a joyful celebration dedicated to honoring those having enriched our lives and the blessings we often overlook. The event was a vibrant tapestry of gratefulness, connection, mental wellbeing, and creativity. During lunchbreak, students and teachers filled our school hall with excitement as they had a great time at a variety of engaging booths. Many embraced their artistic sides by crafting beautiful gifts and tokens of appreciation for their loved ones. Meanwhile, others dove into fun activities that promoted emotional awareness and encouraged better care for their wellbeing. A highlight of the day was the Gratitude Wall, where participants shared uplifting messages of thanks. This colorful display served as a powerful reminder of the love, support and positivity within our community.

#### (2) Benevolence Week

Our Benevolence Week offered students a unique opportunity to put themselves in senior citizens' shoes and understand their challenges through a series of interactive activities designed to simulate age-related difficulties. Meanwhile, having visited the elderly in Shek Kip Mei, our senior form students described the interactions and shared the insights with their schoolmates about communicating and connecting with older generations. Teachers from other secondary schools and representatives from the Education Bureau also joined us during the week. Having fostered empathy and raised awareness of elderly care among students and visitors, we hope the compassion for old people's needs will continue to inspire our acts of kindness towards the elderly in the community.

#### (3) Community Services

To foster our Values Education as an essential element of whole-person education through the provision of relevant learning experiences, we organized a variety of activities showing our love and care for the community thereby strengthening students' sense of compassion for others. Examples include visiting the elderly in our district, dim sum making volunteer activity with elderly participants, and flag selling.

#### (4) Holistic Dialogue with the Body and Soul

Our school library offered a workshop on the essential knowledge related to physical and mental health to help students address their wellbeing from a holistic perspective encompassing the body, mind, and spirit. Hosted by the Hong Kong Federation of Youth Groups, the workshop included:

- an interactive game incorporating life knowledge and skills for awareness and emotional management, enhancing students' understanding of the relationship between emotions and physical as well as mental health
- an experiential activity about connecting the body and mind through conscious

breathing, focusing on the present moment to become aware of personal states and listen to inner messages

a book sharing and Q&A session

#### (5) Campus Relay Run

As usual, we had our Inter-class Campus Relay Run. Participants enjoyed a beautiful afternoon running together and fostering their class spirit. With an aim to promote physical and mental wellbeing as well as further strengthen our school community, the energy and enthusiasm displayed in this event were truly inspiring.

#### (6) Treasure Hunt Day

Our memorable Treasure Hunt Day transformed the school hall into a vibrant hub of laughter, creativity, and camaraderie, which was just the boost we needed before the commencement of our final exam. With booths of riddles, lavender essential oils crafted by our budding aromatherapists, snapshots, heartwarming thank you cards for loved ones, lucky clover origami as tiny tokens of resilience for the exam season and more, the event reminded us all that even in busy times, joy can be found in simple pleasures like a shared laugh, a creative spark of fun, and the memories made together.

#### (7) Wellness Buddies Programme

Our Wellness Buddies Programme, organised by The Mental Health Association of Hong Kong, aimed to nurture mental resilience among students. Through regular meetings, our students engaged in discussions and activities that fostered a supportive community. A highlight of the programme included visits to the Chill Lab, an experimental youth mental health game space where students explored relaxation techniques and mindfulness practices through interactive games. As ambassadors of mental wellbeing, our Wellness Buddies also took part in the Treasure Hunt Day, where they promoted awareness and shared resources with their peers, encouraging everyone to prioritize their emotional awareness.

#### (8) Activities to recognize students' talents, efforts and achievements

To nurture an appreciative ethos through recognizing students' talents, efforts and achievements, we had large-scale events as usual such as our art exhibition and STEAM carnival to showcase students' good works.

#### (9) Themed Closing Ceremony

Our Closing Ceremony, with "Expressing Gratitude, Honoring Dedication, and Celebrating Achievements" as the theme, was a significant occasion for all members of the school to honour the achievements of our students as well as the tremendous support and guidance from our dedicated teachers and loving parents.

#### (10) Reading Periods

Throughout the year, articles on positive values were given to students in the reading periods. For example, students were introduced to the great performance of athletes in the Olympic Games, thereby learning about positive values such as perseverance and diligence.

#### Reflection

- Curriculum mapping is needed to identify related teaching content of different KLA on a certain value for better collaboration.
- Existing annual events could be better explored and utilized to promote positive values.

#### Feedback and Follow-up

- Important values apart from "benevolence" could be picked as a theme for activities held by different KLA.
- To better make use of existing events to promote positive values, for example, there could be a zone in the STEAM Carnival designated for this purpose apart from the other chiefly scientific zones.

## Major Concern 3: To foster biliteracy and trilingualism among students.

#### **Achievements**

This major concern was achieved through various activities and practices. Some salient examples include the following.

#### (1) English Lunchtime Activities

A wide range of engaging English activities were organized during lunchtime to provide students with opportunities to practise and utilize the language. These activities include interclass debates, movie appreciation sessions, festive celebrations, and more, transforming non-instructional time into valuable language practice in an enjoyable environment.

#### (2) Morning Assembly Presentations and Speeches

- To enhance students' public speaking skills and boost their confidence in expressing themselves effectively in English, regular morning assembly presentations were arranged. English teachers trained and guided students to deliver speeches, allowing them to develop their speaking prowess and communicate with clarity and confidence. These presentations served as a platform for students to showcase their language skills and engage with their peers in a public setting.
- Our speeches under the national flag and flag raising ceremonies were conducted in Putonghua.

#### (3) Reading Culture

To expose students to English texts of different themes and genres, teachers of all subjects took turns to prepare reading articles for our junior section's reading periods every cycle. Authentic subject-related materials and news articles were used. Students immersed themselves in the language through reading the texts, learning the targeted vocabulary, and sharing their thoughts with their classmates in discussions.

#### (4) External English Competitions

Students were invited to take part in prestigious English events such as Hong Kong Schools Speech Festival, Creative Speech Competition, and Hong Kong Young Writers Awards. These competitions provided them with valuable opportunities to enhance and demonstrate their language proficiency, compete with peers from other schools, and gain recognition for their achievements.

#### (5) Cross-curricular Collaboration

In our interclass Form 1 and Form 2 Science Video Competition, students learnt how to deliver science knowledge using English. Outstanding videos were disseminated to all students in the school and shown in Form 1 and Form 2 classes.

#### (6) Language Use during Mass Events and MC Training

 School ambassadors and student helpers interacted with guests in English during our Information Day and S1 Interview Day. Both senior and junior student representatives had the opportunity to share their school life on the stage in our Admission Talk in English

- and Putonghua. These experiences allowed them to showcase their language proficiency and build their confidence.
- Students were provided with training to become skilled Masters of Ceremonies (MCs) for key events such as our school commencement ceremony, closing ceremony, Speech Day, Information Day, Form 1 Orientation Day, etc. The training equipped them with the necessary skills to engage the audience and create a lively atmosphere using English and Putonghua. By taking on responsibility as an MC, students also developed their leadership abilities, stage presence, and public speaking skills.

#### (7) Exchange Opportunities

- Various mainland exchange tours were organized. Students had opportunities to visit historical, cultural and economic destinations in Sze Yap, Luoyang and Shanghai, immersing themselves in the authentic Putonghua context.
- Students and teachers from Wesley Methodist School Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia visited our school in April for a day dedicated to enriching cultural exchange. Engaging activities hosted in English created a lively and interactive environment for language practice, allowing our students to communicate with the visiting buddies in enjoyable ways.

#### (8) Putonghua Initiatives

To enhance our students' incentive in using Putonghua, we had special initiatives such as a special promotion held after school at our tuck shop. Each student speaking three sentences or more in Putonghua upon their purchase was awarded a small gift. It was a great success with students' keen participation.

#### Reflection

- Students' engagement in our English lunchtime activities could be further enhanced.
- Students' confidence and competence in spoken English in general could be further enhanced.

#### Feedback and Follow-up

- To better engage students in our English lunchtime activities, we could survey students' interests and adjust our programs to offer greater appeal and flexibility.
- To supplement classroom instruction, our English Department explored the measure of investing in a subscription to an advanced AI speaking platform for fostering selfdirected learning and equipping students through personalized feedback and an increased practice volume.

## (3) Student Performance

#### Students' attitude and behavior

Apart from making an effort in their daily learning, our students have shone across different domains, showcasing their diverse talents and tremendous dedication as usual. Our students continued their keen participation in the Speech Festival while our musical team again reaped a number of awards in the Hong Kong School Drama Festival and the EMI Drama Fest. And as always, our budding scientists and inventors have further innovated and transcended boundaries, joining a wide range of science and STEAM programmes and competitions.

Students' personal growth has been fostered by our initiatives to create a supportive and caring campus.
