Shaping Innovators Through STEAM

Scientific Excellence: Triumphs at the Hong Kong Biology Literacy Award

Our brilliant Form 5 students showcased their scientific talents at the Hong Kong Biology Literacy Award (2025/2026), capturing commendable results across the board! Demonstrating exceptional analytical skills, one student clinched Second Class Honours, while four others secured well-deserved Merits.



STEAM Challenge Champion

Twelve of our talented students, a dynamic mix of Chinese and non-Chinese speaking (NCS) participants, took part in the exhilarating Hong Kong STEAM Challenge 2025 organized by the Hong Kong Community Network and sponsored by the Home Affairs Department of HKSAR. In a remarkable display of teamwork and ingenuity, our students emerged victorious, claiming the Championship title!



Silver and Bronze Awards at 2025 Biodiversity Space Exposed Seeds Project: Space Seed Cultivation Experience Competition

Three of our Form 5 students took part in the 2025 Biodiversity Space Exposed Seeds Project: Space Seed Cultivation Experience Competition which involved the cultivation of both normal plant seeds and space-exposed plant seeds, with participants conducting growth measurements to compare their development and presenting their findings in a scientific video presentation. Their dedication and hard work were recognized with the Written Report Silver Award (Senior Secondary Group) and the Cultivation Practices Bronze Award (Senior Secondary Group).



Pioneering the Skies: A Premier Drone Engineering Experience



Our school proudly became the first to pilot a cutting-edge Drone Workshop in collaboration with China Mobile Hong Kong and HKUST. Led by HKUST PhD researchers, our Form 4 students embarked on a high-level engineering journey, transitioning from technical discussions to the hands-on assembly of their own drones. It was a truly privileged exchange with top-tier academics, sparking a passion for future-ready innovation!



HKUST Chinese Herbs Research Programme

Senior form students from the science discipline were selected to participate in a collaborative research study with Professor Tsim Wah-Keung at The Hong Kong University of Science and Technology. Professor Tsim is a Chair Professor in the Division of Life Science. Our research focuses on natural remedies for wound healing and skin care at the Centre for Chinese Medicine Research and Development, with preliminary results suggesting that the fruit of *Citrus medica* has strong anti-inflammatory properties.



Silk Moth Project

Students demonstrated how a silk fan is made from silk threads produced by *Bombyx mori*. In silk production, cocoons are processed before adult emergence so long continuous filaments can be unwound.
